#### A NOTE FROM RAY TOWNSHIP SUPERVISOR ERIC CRUMP

As summer is coming to an end, I hope this message finds you well. I'd like to share an important update regarding the future of waste and recycling services in our community.

#### **Background**

Since 2020, Ray Township has had a contract with GFL Environmental for trash and recycling services. That contract was set to run through 2025, with an option to extend. However, last year, GFL sold its residential operations to Priority Waste. Because of this sale, the existing pricing and terms will not carry forward. Rather than issuing a formal Request for Proposal (RFP), we evaluated options appropriately. The concern was that Priority Waste might be the only company to respond, and delaying action could lead to higher prices.

#### **What We Found**

Our outreach confirmed that the municipal waste hauling market is very limited. Other communities that issued RFPs received just one bid and it was from Priority Waste. We also contacted multiple vendors directly and received no additional interest. It became clear that having multiple companies in the Township could increase resident costs, wear down our roads faster, and complicate service oversight. These findings reflect larger industry trends: consolidation and rising operational costs have made competition scarce.

#### **Industry Challenges**

At our July 15, 2025, Board meeting, Priority Waste explained current challenges:

- Waste trucks now cost over \$150,000 more than they did in 2020
- Labor and insurance costs are up significantly
- Environmental compliance costs continue to grow

#### **Moving Forward**

After careful review, the Township plans to enter a new five-year contract with Priority Waste starting January 1, 2026:

- Trash Service: \$66.00 per unit per quarter (\$22/month or about \$5.50 per weekly pickup)
- Recycling: \$18.00 per unit per quarter (\$6/month)

The contract includes a 5% annual increase, in line with inflation.

#### **Why It Matters**

A single-hauler approach helps keep costs predictable, reduces road wear and traffic, and improves environmental efficiency. This is the most stable and cost-effective option available today.

#### **Next Steps**

We will continue to share updates through our website and newsletters. Thank you for your understanding and support as we work to provide essential services responsibly.

#### A message from the Fire Chief Mark Hoskin......

This year the Ray Township Fire Department will be hosting our annual pancake breakfast on Oct 5th at Camp Rotary. Just follow the signs. We look forward to seeing you there.

The new fire station is coming along and we will hopefully have an Open House before the end of the year!

The crews will be visiting the elementary kids at Endeavor for Fire Safety this fall. We really look forward to this! You can also find us at the library for Read with a Firefighter once a month on a Saturday morning!

Please keep in mind that when you change your clocks, change your batteries in all your detectors. You should also test your detectors once a month by pushing the test button on the top. When changing your batteries, be sure to check the manufacture date. If you have just a smoke detector, it has a maximum 10-year life span. If you have a combination smoke/CO detector, depending on the manufacturer, it may only have a maximum of 7 years.

We have noticed that some of the address posts are weathering and need to be updated to meet Ordinance #58. This is for your safety so that we can easily find your address in case of an emergency.

One last reminder for fall clean-up, make sure you have a 2025 Burn Permit before burning. They are available at the Township Office.
